A 5 Day Bible Study



Read Habakkuk 1:1-17

1.	As Habakkuk observed the world around him, he brought his questions to the Lord. What
	did he ask in 1:2-4? Why was he so bothered? (also see Jer 12:1)

2. What was God's answer to Habakkuk's concerns (1:5-11)? Do you think this is what Habakkuk was expecting to hear?

3. After describing the strength and brutality of the Babylonians (Chaldeans), what was God's summary of their heart condition (1:11)? Why is this so dangerous? (see Prov 8:13, 16:5)

4. From 1:12-17, list reasons Habakkuk struggled with God's solution to the problem.

What questions come to mind as you consider the world around you? Stop now and bring them to the Lord.

Read Habakkuk 2:1-5

- 1. Looking or watching is a theme in this book. What actions did Habakkuk take in 2:1, and what posture of his heart do you perceive? (also see Ps 27:13-14)
- 2. Record God's instructions and promises in verses 2-3.

3. Why is it so hard to wait? What is the benefit of waiting? (also see Ps 130:5-7, Isa 30:18)

4. Two types of people are contrasted in 2:4. Describe the first and what he can expect.

5. A major biblical theme is stated at the end of verse 4. What do the following passages teach?

Genesis 15:6 Romans 1:16-17

Galatians 3:6-11 Hebrews 10:36-39

What do you think living by faith meant for Habakkuk? What does it mean for you?

Read Habakkuk 2:5-20

1. Habakkuk was to write down a series of woes against the Babylonians. Summarize the sins denounced and the consequences they would bring.

Read Habakkuk 3:1-16

1. From his perch on the watchtower (2:1), Habakkuk was given an enhanced perspective of God. From 3:2-6, write key ideas and phrases that reveal his view of God.

2. What characteristics of God are described in verses 7-15?

3. What did Habakkuk request of God in 3:2? What two attributes of God are mentioned, and why are both necessary for a righteous and holy God?

4. What was Habakkuk's response in verse 16? How do you think he was given the strength he needed?

How does an enhanced perspective of God help you face the inevitable trials in life?

1. Summarize in your own words Habakkuk's declaration in these verses.

2. Habakkuk's outlook had changed from the beginning of chapter 1. To what do you attribute this shift?

3. As he awaited the imminent attack from Babylon, how did Habakkuk resist fear or despair?

4. Write your own song of commitment to faith following Habakkuk's example.
